

School Dinners

Unfortunately, from January 2024 school meal prices will increase to £2.65 a meal. As you are aware, we use Cheshire East catering for our school dinners and below is their justification for the increase:

Cheshire East have had substantial increases in food and labour costs over the last 12 months with further increases expected. We are constantly developing our menus and dishes and always looking at alternatives to help absorb these costs so that we can keep any price increases to a minimum whilst still continuing to use where possible local, good quality ingredients without undesirable additives, however due to further increases to labour and reduced subsidy due to local government budgetary pressures we are now having to pass some costs on to our customers.

Medication

Can I please request that all medications come through the main office and any self-medication remedies such as throat sweets, throat soothers, etc. are not permitted. Please do not send any type of medication into school with your child/ren. On the contrary and due to it not being a form of medication, lip balm and hand cream is permitted (as long as this is not prescribed by the GP) for children who suffer from severe chapped hands and lips.

The Importance of Reading

I wanted to start by saying thank you for your support so far. As we end the first term, I thought I would reiterate the importance of early reading and how you can play a huge part in this.

It is widely known that reading for 20 minutes a day at home in addition to reading completed in school, has a profound impact on success in later life. It also widens vocabulary, which invariably has a positive impact on writing. Research also shows that reading for pleasure daily promotes better health and well-being.

As a parent of primary aged children myself, I know how hard it is trying to juggle the balance of work/home life and finding time to read or listen to my children read four times a week. However, reading at home at least 4 times a week, is part of the weekly homework set for all our pupils. I strongly believe and have seen first-hand how positive reading habits can have such a profound impact on a child's development.

Please help us get the very best from your child, by ensuring they are completing their reading homework and that you are detailing their reading in their reading diaries.

Parking Issues in Relation to Drop Off & Pick Up Times

We all strive to set a positive example to others.

Your children and other pedestrians are being put at risk of being seriously injured or worse by drivers who park or drop off illegally. There has also been an increase in vehicles being parked on zig-zags, at junctions restricting the view of other drivers, blocking residents' driveways or the public footpaths.

Pedestrians, in particularly children should be able to cross the road outside close to their school without having their safety compromised.

Relating to the illegal parking complaints recently, we take this opportunity to remind you of the restrictions:

- Parking too close to the junction that causes an obstruction/danger to other road users is an
 offence (within 10 meters of the junction)
- · Causing an obstruction to the footpath is not acceptable and is an offence
- Parking in a way that causes UNNECESSARY or WILFUL OBSTRUCTION to other vehicles/driveways and EMERGENCY vehicles getting down a road is an offence
- Parking in a disabled bay when not in possession of a blue badge
- Parking on a zig-zag in the designated timings

Please be aware that we shall be enforcing these restrictions by way of a £30 Non Endorsable parking ticket and/or points on your driving license.

This enforcement will improve the parking situation on and around Rode Heath Primary School and other roads in the close vicinity.

We are asking you to think about child safety before one is seriously injured or killed.

We are taking this opportunity to educate drivers as opposed to enforcing legislation as we'd rather work with you, than against you as members of the community.
