They will learn how and why Harvest is celebrated in the UK and other parts of the world. They will explore an Autumn festival from another culture e.g. Diwali / Hanukkah They will understand why Christmas is an important festival for Christians and will be able to represent / retell the Christmas Story. 	 Children will learn about the Christian story of 'Creation' They will understand why Easter is important to Christians and will retell a simple version of the Easter story. They will explore a Spring Festival from another culture e.g. Vietnamese New Year / Holi and will discuss how they differ from the Christian festivals they have learned about. 	 Children will understand that the Bible is a special book for Christians and they will learn about some of the stories from the Bible. They will also know that other faiths also have a special book. They will explore a Summer Festival from another culture e.g. Eid al-Fitr and will discuss similarities and differences between some of the various festivals they have learned about.
