


# March 2024 Newsletter

Unfortunately, due to rising costs we have had to make the difficult decision to increase our prices from April 2024 onwards. We have agreed a price increase of £2 to both school aged children and pre-school children.

The price for holiday club from April 2024 will be: School Aged children - £28 per day Pre-school aged children - £32 per day

We will continue to provide a safe, enjoyable environment in our Holiday Clubs with lots of different activities available for all children to enjoy. We are looking forward to seeing you all in our upcoming Easter Holiday Club. Booking will be available via your ScoPay account from Monday 4<sup>th</sup> March.
