


April 2025 Newsletter



Dear Parents/Carers.

Welcome to April's edition of our newsletter and I hope you all have a wonderful break over the next two weeks. We return to school on Tuesday 22^{nd} April and please remember the importance of arriving to school on-time.

School Start Times

Reception and KS1: 8:45 - 3:15

Staff will be out on the infant playground at 8:40am. At 8:45 a member of staff will blow the whistle. This is the signal for the children to line up and the start of the school day. Please could I ask parents/carers to stand back from the class lines once the whistle is blown allowing all the children to be seen by their teacher. Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 finish the school day at 3:15pm.

Key Stage Two: 8:50 - 3:20

Key stage two children have a staggered start to the day to help ease traffic congestion outside of the school gates and to reduce overcrowding in the cloakrooms. Children can enter their classrooms from 8:40am, and should be in school by 8:50am. The junior gate is locked at 8:55am. Year 3 to Year 6 children finish the school day at 3:20pm.

If your child arrives after these times, they will be given a late mark. Persistent lateness may result in a meeting with parents.

Emergency evacuations

Every half term, we conduct a fire drill and the children practise leaving the school quickly and calmly. We have done this for many years and they are now very skilled at leaving the building promptly to line up in their allocated fire assembly points on our playgrounds. As of the summer term, we will introduce a lockdown drill using a newly installed lockdown alarm system. We will practice moving to safe areas within the school. Before we complete this drill for the first time, I will speak to the children about this and why we need it. I will explain that this alarm may be used if there is a stranger on the playground or if there is a loose animal outside and that we need to move to safe areas within school.


Medication

We will then follow the instructions and administer the paracetamol as per your request.
