


June 2025 Newsletter

#### \*Reception Places for September 2025\*

We currently still have available places for Reception in September 2025. Please spread the word.... As you know, our Reception is the starting block to our main school and it is where the children begin their school journey. It really is a place where children have an abundance of opportunities to play, discover and learn.

## \*Pre-School Places for September 2025\*

We currently still have available places for Pre-School in September 2025. The Pre-School offers a wide range of exciting activities and resources, which promote each child's learning across all areas of the Early Years Foundation Stage framework.

#### **Out of Hours Club**

We offer "Wrap-around care" by our before and after-school club "All Stars" including our holiday club which provides care on specific weeks throughout the school holidays. Our School Academic year runs for 39 weeks; however, we are able to offer 45 weeks of the year with our "Wrap-around care" provision. These three extended services ensure that children aged 3 to 11 are in a safe, nurturing environment that caters for the needs of modern families.

We are making some positive changes to our Out of Hours provision for the rest of this academic year. We are aware that our provision is very popular and most of the time, it is full. Our plan is to remove the cap on the number of children who can attend breakfast and after-school club. This will be done on a trial basis and then it will be reviewed in the summer.

From this week, you must use the on-line booking system to ensure your child has a place in our OOH club. Please refrain from turning up without a booking. The main reason we have the booking system is to ensure we have the correct number of staff and ratios to ensure we have a safe and fun provision. If you turn up without a booking, you will incur a £20 admin fee.

#### **Lateness**

Recently, we have had a few cases of children not being picked up on time. If this is for an unavoidable reason then it is permitted; however, if you are persistently late then you may incur a £20 admin fee.

### **Lost Property**

The lost property pile is huge! Lots of jumpers, cardigans and hoodies are unnamed. If you feel that you are missing an item or two, please inform your child's teacher. If there are any uncollected items by the end of the year, we will hold a uniform stall so these items can be re-used by our community.

#### **September 2025 Transition**

All children in Reception to Year 5 will be moving up to their new classrooms on **Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> July**. The vast majority of our Year 6 children will be visiting Alsager High as part of their high school transition.

#### **Sports Days**

Our school sports afternoons will be held on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> June at 1:15pm for children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6. Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will take part in their sports afternoon on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> of June at 1:15pm. *Please ensure* your child wears their school PE kit (House coloured t-shirt) for their Sports Day event.
